Digital and sustainable transformations have been explored in the literature for some time now by considering either the changes involved in farms companies and business activities or the necessary adjustments of the economic and regulatory environments. However the setting up of strategies related to the digitalization for sustainable agrifood value chains has not often been investigated.
